Core Values, Upcoming commemorative events

A 25 year Afghanistan Veterans' commemoration of service will be held at the Te Awamutu RSA on Saturday 29 August starting at 1400 hours. Veterans and families, support personnel and interested parties are encouraged to attend and participate in the commemoration.

The event will commence at 1400 hours with a welcome and powhiri, Major Cameron Stapleton will address the gathering and introduce a screening of the video "Afghanistan: The Soldiers Story", followed by a commemorative service and recognition of personnel lost during New Zealand's Afghanistan deployment. Veterans are encouraged to meet and remember at the completion of the service. Food and liquid refreshments will be available at veterans' own cost.

Friday 21st August at 1400 hours at Memorial Park the reinstated Peace Fountain will be commemorated with a service and the unveiling of a plaque recognising personnel who served in the Pacific War. Speakers from Waipa District Council and the RSA will relate to the significance of the Peace Fountain in Memorial Park. Participants are encouraged to return to the RSA and enjoy light refreshments at their own cost.

Friday 21st August, the Te Awamutu RSA will commemorate Vietnam Veterans at 1800 hours with the Ode and recognising the local veterans who served in Vietnam and have since passed away. Operational Service Maritime Area Tahī – new declarations

NZDF personnel who deployed within the Operational Service Maritime Area Tahī are now eligible for support.

Declarations for Qualifying Operational Service have now been made for deployments between:

1 April 1991 to 30 June 2024

15 March 2025 to 25 May 2025

16 March 2026 to 16 September 2026

Total mobility

Total Mobility is a national door-to-door transport scheme designed to increase the mobility of people with disabilities.

The scheme provides financial help, giving registered users a 50 per cent discount on taxi fares. The total discount can be up to \$18.75 for Waipa residents, with the user paying the rest of the fare to the taxi driver. People who use the scheme must carry a valid Total Mobility photo ID card to get the discounted fare.

Examples of mobility limitations which would qualify for Total Mobility:

If you're unable to walk to the nearest bus stop or get on and off a bus because of pain, respiratory problems, inability to see or hear, you rely on complex walking aids or if you need someone else's help to get around.

Total loss of or severe impairment of vision which prevents you from using public transport alone.

Intellectual or psychiatric disabilities which may mean you need help from someone else.

Anyone who has a disability living within the boundaries of Hamilton City, Waikato District, Waipā, Matamata-Piako, Thames, Whitianga, Tokoroa or Taupō (within the defined Total Mobility zone as specified by Taupō District Council boundaries) can apply for an eligibility assessment.

You can only apply through one of the accredited support agencies participating in the scheme. They are responsible for ensuring that membership and photo ID card applications are completed correctly and returned to the Waikato Regional Council.

The assessor will take an identification photo of you and collect information from you about your disability.

Each trip entitles you to a 65 per cent discount on your taxi fare, up to a maximum fare amount of \$22.50.

Please ensure you pay your portion of the fare at the time of the trip.

The maximum subsidised fare is set at \$22.50 across the Waikato region.

For example, this means that if the fare is \$35, the subsidy covers \$22.50, and the user will need to pay the taxi driver \$12.50.

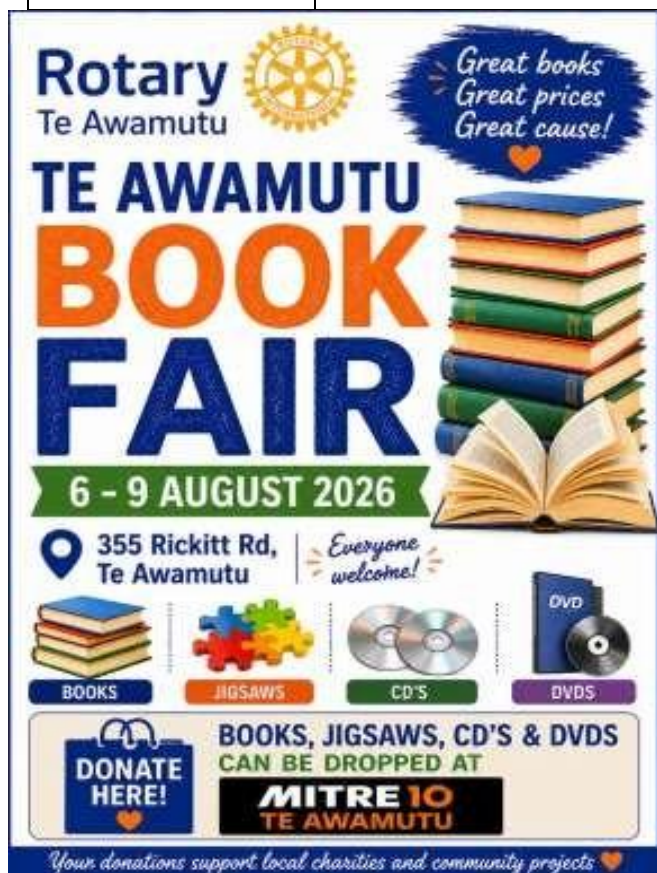

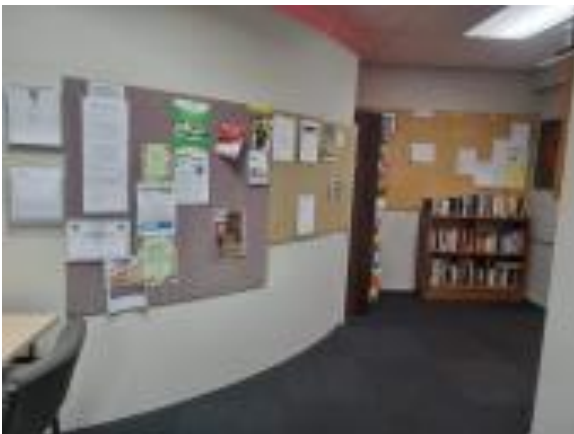
